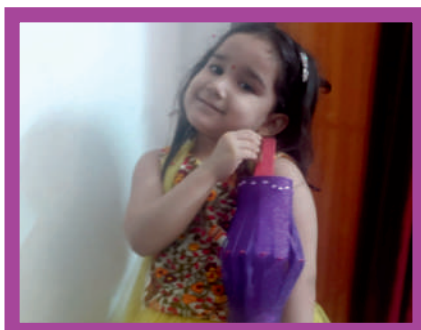


Diwali Celebration
