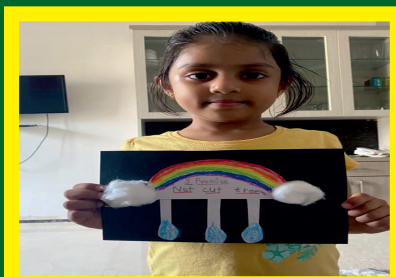

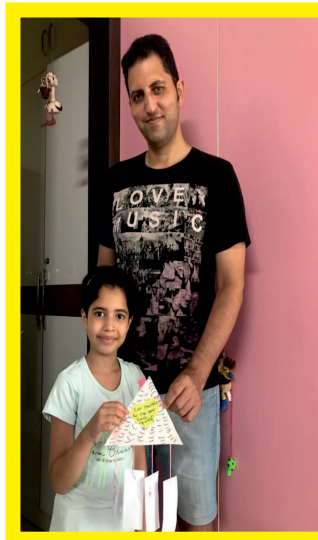
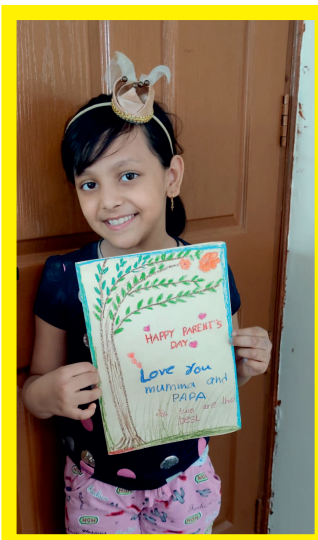


My World, My Parents
